



History of the Park Authority

- The BOS created the Fairfax County Park Authority on December 6, 1950 as a separate entity from the County
 - ► Purpose: To acquire, plan, develop, maintain, and operate parks and park facilities in Fairfax County
- Park Authority firsts:
 - First Park: Eakin Park, donated by the Eakin family, 1951
 - ► First Purchased land —16 acres in Great Falls, 1953
 - First Park Bond \$4M for land acquisition only, 1959




The Park System at a Glance


2020 Park Bond Allocations (\$100M)





Park Services Division

- RECenter Operations: plan, manage and operate9 RECenters.
- ► RECenter Classes and Programs: provide health, fitness, and wellness programs
- Lakefronts & Waterparks: 3 lakefront parks provide amusements, rides, picnic facilities, campgrounds, and water activities.









Park Operations Division

- Maintain all Park Authority owned buildings
- Provide grounds maintenance for 429 parks
- Athletic field maintenance (parks and schools)
- Parks & Trail Maintenance









Resource Management Division

- Natural Resources & Stewardship Education
- Collaboration with Schools on education programs
- Community Gardens, Farmers Markets, and Nature Centers
- Natural Resource Management -plant and animal diversity and restoring ecosystems
- > 78% of Parkland remains in natural state
- Partner with Department of Public Works and Environmental Services on Stream Restoration









Resource Management Division

- Archaeology Collections & Preservation of Historic Structures
- Responsible for curating artifacts and collections for Fairfax County
- Review all development projects related to History and Archaeology
- Preserving & maintaining historic structures
- ▶ 3.5 Million Artifacts & 10,000 museum items









Golf Enterprises

- Manage, operate and maintain 8 golf courses
- Facility operations including clubhouses, driving ranges, picnic areas, and mini golf
- Classes, events, and programs for all ages and skill levels












What Is a Park Master Plan?

- Written report and/or a Conceptual Development Plan (CDP)
- Defines areas of use, park design, and planned amenities
- Sets expectations and informs financial decisions
- Requires approval from the Park Authority Board






Master Planning Process
